### Problem:

The construction

Women make up 10% of the construction workforce

African Americans make up 6.5% of the construction workforce

The average age of the construction worker is 42



### Solution:

Create an Industry Recognized point of entry for underrepresented, underemployed, & unemployed people to access a life-sustaining career in the union trades

27% of BUD grads are women

78% of BUD grads are people of color

The median age of BUD grads is 25
